MEETING MINUTES September 15, 2015

A Meeting of the New Britain Township Parks and Recreation Advisory Board was held on September 15, 2015 at the Township Administration Building, 207 Park Avenue, New Britain Township, Pa., beginning at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were: Charles Maeyer, Dan Mackintosh, William Jones, James Bender, Samuel Garcia and David Turcich. Also, in attendance was Jo Ann Lapp, New Britain Township Staff.

- 1. Approval of Minutes of July 21, 2015:** Upon motion by Mr. Mackintosh, seconded by Mr. Jones the July 21, 2015 minutes were approved as written.
- 2. Movie Night:** Mr. Bender reported that the crowd was lower than last year, which could be attributed to the choice of an old movie instead of a new animated movie. Mr. Jones suggested the Board should decide on a date and movie earlier next year to get the information to the schools before they close for summer vacation. It was also suggested that we try another week night. The Board will think about having it on a Thursday or Friday instead of Saturday next year.
- 3. Santa House:** Tentative dates of Friday, December 4 and Friday, December 11 were set for the Santa House. Mrs. Lapp will confirm with Bob Skelton.
- 4. Other Business:** Mr. Jones mentioned that the Township staff and Supervisors are working on the 2016 budget. Mr. Bender asked if any money will be in the budget for Cotton Park. Mr. Jones said because of the high cost of developing the park the Township will wait for grants to become available and maybe work with the developer to move dirt while their equipment is on site. He told the Board that the Township is unable to use open space funds for Cotton Park because it did not cost the Township any money to acquire the land.


